## **Programs and Events**

### Walk and Talk Series

- Being Mindful in Your Body Aubrey led breathing and mindfulness exercises to support emotional and mental well-being. Patrons left with practical tools for stress management.
- Well-Being Tips & Tricks Held on a rainy day, this session shifted into an impromptu staff training. The information was valuable for our own team and will help us share resources with patrons.
- Upcoming Our next Walk and Talk will focus on the Basics of Birding at Parvin Lake. We may add another Walk and Talk before the end of the month.

### Outdoor Painting Classes

Two sessions with Susan O'Connell were successful, with participants requesting more. We are exploring future offerings.

### New Adult/Family Program: Paint and Pour

Scheduled for October 8 at the Mountain Meeting Place. Kylie created a great promotional flyer. This class makes it simple for participants to complete a "masterpiece" with little effort—accessible and fun.

# • Community Resource Support

Jo Buckley continues hosting monthly pop-up tents at the pantry. She is helping secure resources for a patron in a precarious living situation, and Annie and I are actively supporting this effort.

### Colorado Blueprint Grant

I am preparing an application to fund food purchases for the pantry.

# USDA Opportunities

I will attend a community meeting with Kefalas and USDA representatives to learn about new grant opportunities.

# Next Fifty Initiative

I was invited to apply for a Next Fifty grant to fund a consultant for North 40 sustainability. They also expressed interest in supporting a caregiver relief program. I will work with Mountain Ministries to design this program, which could be hosted by either the Library or North 40 MA.

Jo Buckley has also offered assistance in writing pantry grants and connected me to grant writing training opportunities.
